
One day, while Abraham was sitting in the entrance of his tent, he looked up and saw three men standing nearby. The Bible tells us that one of these men was the LORD.


"Where is your wife Sarah?" they asked.

Then one of them said, "I am going to return to you about this time next year and your wife Sarah will have had a son."








As Abraham talked with the LORD and begged him, "Will you destroy *all* the people in the city? What if you can find 50 good and righteous people? Would you still destroy the city?"

The LORD said, "If there are 50 people doing what is right, I will spare the city."




Then Abraham spoke again. He said, "I have been very bold to speak to you. After all, I'm only dust and ashes. What if the number of people doing what is right is only 45?"

So the LORD answered, "If there are only 45 good people, I will not destroy the city."




Abraham said. "What if there are only 40 righteous people?"

The LORD replied, "If there are only 40, I will spare the city."




"Please do not be angry with me," Abraham pleaded. "What if there are only 30 good and righteous people that can be found?"

The LORD said, if there are 30 righteous people in the city I will not destroy it."




Abraham said, "I have been very bold to speak to you Lord. What if only 20 can be found there?"
