
The LORD spoke to Jacob and said, "Go back to the land of your fathers and to your family, and I will be with you."


Right before they left, Rachael had gone into her father's tent and stole some of his "household" idols.


After leaving, Jacob stopped in the Gilead Hill Country. A week later Laban caught up to him and his family.


"And why did you steal my household idols?" Laban continued. "I understand that you have left because you want to be with your father's family, but why take my things?"

Now, Jacob did not know that Rachael had stolen the idols. So he said, "I did not take them. And if you find anyone among my group who has them, they will be put to death."




