







So Jacob set off on the long journey that took him north toward Harran where Laban and his family dwelt.




As he was travelling, he stopped for the night since the sun had gone down. Jacob took a large stone and placed it under his head like a pillow and went to sleep.




Early the next morning, Jacob took the stone that he had placed under his head and set it up as a pillar and poured oil on top of it.




Jacob called the place where he had had the dream "Beth-el." This is Hebrew for "House of God." Formerly the place had been known as the city of Luz.
